

Impotent clarinet succeeded by sax

Music from the reed instruments that fill the air during NU football games are saxophones, not clarinets. UNL's band director, Robert Fought, said clarinets can't be heard in Memorial Stadium.

Fought said the clarinets were replaced by saxophones last year because the clarinets' volume is too small and they "don't contribute to the sound of the band."

Most woodwind instruments are left out of the ranks, Fought said. Twelve piccolos have replaced the flutes because the high pitch of the instrument can be heard better in the stadium.

Because it is easy for woodwind players to play other woodwind instruments, Fought said, the best players were chosen during auditions regardless of their instrument. However, students who played oboe, bassoon, bass clarinet, alto clarinet or baritone saxophone were asked to play saxophone, he said.

"If we had no limit on instrumentation, we would let them play their own instruments," Fought said. The marching band is limited to 200 members because of the stadium's size and the room needed for shows, he said.

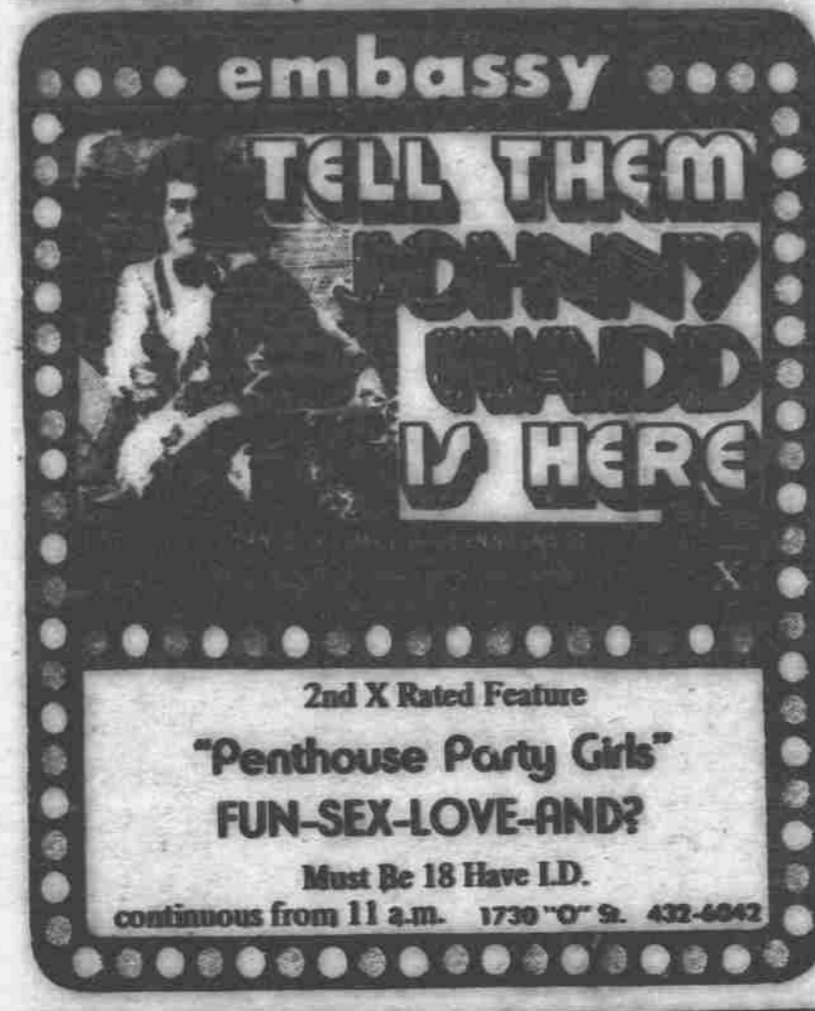
Experts to speak on assassinations

Three authorities on assassinations will speak at 7:30 tonight in the Nebraska Union. The panel is sponsored by the Union Program Council (UPC) as part of the *Power and Conspiracy in America: Who's in Control?* symposium.

Mark Lane, founder of the Citizens Commission of Inquiry in to the assassination of John Kennedy, will speak with Donald Freed, author of *The Killing of RFK*, and Jeff Cohen, who is a researcher with the Assassination Information Bureau and has written *From Messiah to Martyr: The King Assassination* about the assassination of Martin Luther King.

Elaine Brown, chairwoman of the Black Panther party, will speak Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. in the Union. Brown is also executive director of the Educational Opportunities Corp., which operates the Oakland, Calif., Community School and the Oakland Community Learning Center.

Brown, who is a singer, currently is under contract with Motown Records. She will speak about *Whatever Happened to the Black Panthers*.

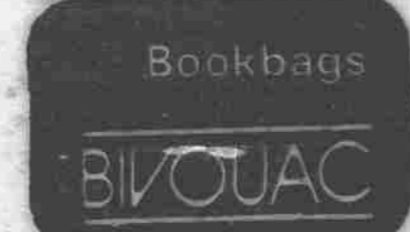
