Varner said recent legislation passed by Congress provides that no federal financing be discontinued without due process of law.

"The university has been working hard on this issue to correct any faults there may be," Varner said. He said he could not speculate on what would come out of the issue because he does not know what the HEW investigators will find.

Varner said the university made a major effort this year to increase women's salaries to the level of men in the same positions. This depends on degrees and experience, he said.

"Salaries for women are no better now than they were two years ago when the complaint was filed," said a spokesman for the ad hoc committee on women's concerns, who wished to remain anonymous.

Another source from the committee, who also did not want to be named, said the discrimination is based on the department level. However, he added that he thought administrators were covering up for department heads.

"I will go so far as to say there are a couple of people high up in the administration who could lose their jobs

after the HEW investigations are completed," the spokesman said.

The ad hoc committee sources declined to speak publicly on the issue because they said they probably would lose their jobs. Few of the faculty and staff involved in the original complaint are in their original positions, one spokesman said.

People are being fired because they spoke out on the issue, another source said.

"I can't believe that," Varner said about those allegations.

The HEW investigators will complete their work at UNL this week. A report from HEW is expected in January. Milan said he didn't know what had caused the delay from October, 1974 until now.

"The length of time involved in the investigation depends on the nature and extent of the complaint," he said.


