Lack of quorum stalls FAB

Audit procedures were on the agenda for Fees Allocation Board (FAB) Wednesday night. However, since there was not a quorum with six out of the 13 members present, no decisions were made, but suggestions were given.

Jack Baier, FAB advisor, said that procedures for audits need to be consistent. He suggested line item budgets, so that when FAB considers the budget of an organization, it knows exactly what it is considering, what it is cutting and what needs more money.

FAB doesn't break down each organization's programs, specifying how much money should be spent where, Baier explained, it only allocates a lump sum of money to the group.

All suggestions for procedure changes will be considered at the Dec. 8 meeting.
