ASUN CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS TO BE ADDED TO THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

ON 16 MARCH 1877:

AMENDMENT 1

Add to Article IV, Section 1, dealing with the
"Powers Relating to Organizations" the following

D. To have final approval of the allocation of Student Fees to Student Organizations, without which such funds shall neither be collected nor dispersed.

AMENDMENT 2

Change Article VI, Section D, dealing with the Electoral Commission Powers, from: D. Duties. The duties of the Electoral Commission shall be:

 To announce filings and schedule elect-ion dates for all elections conducted by the Association.

 To publicize the dates and procedures for filing and elections, and to issue at the request of candidates advisory opinions as to the legality of proposed methods in election campaigns.

3. To establish polling places and to supervise the balloting at each polling place, either in person or through agents authorized and announced by the Commission one week prior to the election, 4. To tabulate the ballots, with at least

at least one of them being a faculty representative. 5. To seal the ballots, tabulations and computations and deliver them to the

three Commissioners being present and

senior faculty representative for safe-keeping for a thirty (30) day period. 6. To announce the complete results of the election to the press, including the number of votes cast for each candidate,

and to be prepared, upon request, to issue a break-down of Presidential votes and votes cast on amendments and referenda by colleges.

D. Duties. The duties of the Electoral Com-mission shall be to carry on the following functions with the advice and consent of the (Points 1-6 remain the same.)
AMENDMENT 3 Senate.

Change Article VII, Section 4, Paragraph C, dealing with Recall vote, from:

1. By a petition signed by thirty-five (35) percent of all the regularly enrolled full-time students enrolled in a college to require the Electoral Commission to schedule and conduct within fifteen (15) class days a special election for the Senate seat in question in that college by the final apportionment at the Spring eneral election.

By a petition signed by thirty-five (35) percent of all the regularly-enrolled fulltime students of the entire University, to require the Electoral Commission to schedule and conduct within fifteen (15) class days a special election for the Presidency, or First and Second Vice Presidency of the Association.

1. By a petition signed by Twenty-five (25) percent of all regularly enrolled fulltime students enrolled in a college to require the Electoral Commission to schedule and conduct within fifteen (15) class days a Special Election for the Senate seat in question in that college by the final apportionment at the Spring

2. By a petition signed by twenty-five (25) percent of all regularly enrolled fullrequire the Electoral Commission to schedule and conduct within fifteen (15) class days a special election for the Presidency and/or First and/or Second Vice-Presidency of the Association.
