Wilderness trips highlight recreation schedule

Three wilderness excursions and a faculty-staff tennis tournament highlight this summer's University of Nebraska-Lincoln recreation department program.

These events supplement the department's summer service of lending sports and camping equipment.

Two of the wilderness trips will take eight students to the Rocky Mountains for 10 days of camping. The third involves four days of canoeing down the Snake River in the Nebraska Sandhills.

The trips will cost participating students from \$30 for the Snake River canos trip, to \$97 for 10 days in Rocky Mountain National Park, to \$113 for 10 days of hiking and rock climbing in the Wind River Range in Wyoming.

The regreation department recommends the Wind River trip for experienced rock climbers only, while the

Rocky Mountain National Park outing is for "hardy backpackers" and the Snake River trip is for beginning canonists.

All trips are still open.

The recreation department also rents camping and sports equipment to students who want to strike out on their own. Costs range from \$18 per week for cances to \$1,50 per week for a rod and reel or a set of golf clubs. Sports equipment, including basketballs, footballs, and Prisbees, is available at no cost.

The informal classes and seminars in sports and dancing that were available in past summers have been eliminated this way.

Gale Wiedow, coordinator of program planning in

recreation, explained that the classes were cancelled because they duplicated courses offered by the physical education department.

UNL athletic facilities will also be open to recreation.

"The Loneliness Factor" will alternate with "Rain"




