The heritage and culture of one group of the Scandinavian people will be celebrated this year at the Nebraska State Fair.

Of the estimated 2.5 million Danes and Danish extraction in the country, about 60 per cent of them live in the Midwest, One hundred thousand Danes can be found in the Nebraska-Iowa region. During the State Fair, quite a few of them will be found right here in Lincoln.

Every Danish and Danish-American organization in Nebraska as well as six international organizations will be represented at the State Fair Sept. 2-11.

This is the second year an ethnic group was invited by the State Fair Commission in Lincoln, according to State Fair manager Henry Brandt. Last year the Czechs were honored.

Gary Eilts, director of fraternal affairs for Danish Brotherhood in American National Headquarters in Omaha, will coordinate demonstrations and activities.


