

# UNL's graduates honored at upcoming Masters Week

Ten distinguished UNL graduates have been invited to tell their experiences at Masters Week, Nov. 9-12 on the UNL campus.

The program, sponsored by Mortar Board, Innocents Society and the Alumni Association, gives students a chance to talk to graduates who have "made it", according to co-chairman Dave Roehr.

The grads are scheduled to address student groups in residence halls, Greek houses and classrooms as well as attend a chancellor's luncheon, an Alumni House reception and the NU-Kansas football game.

"It's quite an honor to be invited back to the old alma mater as a master," Roehr said.

E. Thone Johnson of Fremont is one such master. He is a former state senator and is presently the director of the Fremont National Bank, the Equitable Federal Savings and Loan Assoc. of Fremont, and Nebraska State Board of Agriculture and the State Fair Board. He graduated from NU in 1927 with a B.S. degree in Agriculture.

Others include Dr. Phillip E. Franson, Herbert A. Belkin, John P. Rossie, Gerald G. Toy, Marilyn Coffey, James W. Hanson, Robert F. Krohn and Edward McConnell.

Franson is the dean of University Extension at the University of California Los Angeles. He has a doctorate in Adult Education and Sociology from UCLA and took his B.A. and M.A. degrees in geography and economics at UNL.
