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Panitt defends cooperation with CIA

The editorial director of TV Guide magazine, Merrill Panitt, says he cooperated with the CIA in 1958 in an association which he calls "remarkable only for its dullness."

Panitt defends his relationship with the agency in a copyright story in the magazine's Oct. 1 issue.

"I don't see anything morally or journalistically wrong in a member of the press giving information or observations to the CIA on a one-time or even on a regular basis," Panitt wrote.

Panitt said he was prompted to make public his CIA connection by Carl Bernstein's report in "Rolling Stone" magazine that 400 American newspapermen have worked with or for the CIA.
