The center is a place where Christians can gather, as well as provide an outreach for non-Christians, he said. Programs offered are soul talks, life groups and Friday night devotionals.

Soul talks take place three nights a week. About 25 students get together and talk about God and man's relationship to him, Penner said.

The life groups are a time for informal sharing, he explained. Usually, a biblical passage is read and students discuss how the passage relates to the

The 7 p.m. Friday devotional usually includes singing and a bible study, he

The two story, white framed house is not a church, Penner emphasized, it is a student center.

"Students can become confused. The center in no way tries to act as a substitute for church life," he said.
