finale did not end the way he had planned. Harvey, a senior from Lexington, was forced to leave the game in the first quarter with a separated shoulder.

Harvey said UNL trainers did not know if the injury would keep him out for the rest of the season.

"Yea, it's a disappointing way to go out at home," Harvey said. "There's not a whole lot you can say or do about it though. People have had it a lot worse off than me."

The game against the Sooners Nov. 25, in Norman will decide the Big 8 Conference Orange Bowl representative. The Huskers must beat the Sooners to share the Big 8 title.
