

# 1978 SUMMER READING COURSES

## Schedule of Spring Meeting March 30 - April 18

Attend several spring meetings to find out what is required. Independent study over summer. Complete coursework in the fall. (meetings, conferences, papers, tests) Grades recorded in late October.

- REGISTRATION OPENS: 8:00 a.m., Thursday, April 20 at 511 Nebraska Hall.
- REGISTRATION CLOSES: 5:00 p.m., Friday, May 12.
- FULL PAYMENT of tuition is required at time of registration  
Nebraska residents—\$21 per credit hour  
Non-residents—\$57 per credit hour
- EARLY REGISTRATION: Tuesday, April 18, and Wednesday, April 19.  
(open ONLY to PERMIT holders registering for courses apt to close before May 12, 1978, including ALL English courses and History 102c, 424c, and 824c)
- PERMIT TO REGISTER EARLY—will be available only at the Spring Meetings from the teachers of the courses listed in item 4.
- Attend several spring meetings to find out what is required.
- P/F is optional unless otherwise stated with the course. Prerequisites will be as given in the latest college catalog.
- Complete the coursework in September or early October: fall meetings, conferences, papers, examinations—as required.
- Grades will be recorded in late October.
- To DROP your SRC enrollment:  
a. send a WRITTEN REQUEST TO DROP to the DIVISION OF CONTINUING STUDIES.  
b. "without a grade" is possible until Friday, July 14.  
c. "with a grade of W" is possible (after 7/14) and until Friday, September 8, 1978.  
d. signature of the teacher and your college dean will be needed after September 8, 1978.
- PARTIAL REFUND—NONE after July 14, 1978.  
a. A \$10 service charge will be made to DROP on or before Friday, July 14, 1978.  
b. NO REFUND—if the DROP REQUEST, in writing, is received AFTER July 14, 1978.
