## Congressman calls farm bill a 'rotten election-year hoax'

Washington - The emergency farm aid package headed for voters in the Senate and House - and a presidential veto if it passes - is an election-year hoax, says a disgruntled congressman, designed to lay blame for farmer's troubles on the presi-

The bill was approved Tuesday by conferees from the House and Senate, despite administration promises of a veto.

"It's an election issue, and it's rotten," said Rep. Frederick Richmond, D-N.Y., a dissenting member of the conference committee. "It's a hoax on the farmers that this will become law."

The congressmen said conferees approved the bill because "it cleans their skirts. They can blame it on the president."

"I'm disgusted," he added. "This is a disservice to the Democratic party and to the farmers."

#### Lead poisoning study

Washington - The government has spent seven years and nearly \$9 million in research, but it still doesn't know how best to prevent children from poisoning themselves by eating lead based paint.

In 1971 and 1973, Congress ordered the Department of Housing and Urban Development "to determine the nature and extent of the problem of lead-based paint poisoning the United States, particularly in urban areas, and the methods by which lead-based paint can be most effectively removed from . . . surfaces to which children may be commonly exposed."

A lengthy reported obtained by The Associated Press concedes that HUD still doesn't know the nature and extent of the problem or how best to solve it. It recommends further study

London - Queen Elizabeth II has given her younger sister, Princess Margaret, a royal ultimatum: end her relationship with brewery heir and aspiring night club singer Roddy Llewellyn or withdraw from public

Buckingham Palace declined comment on the front-page report by the Sun news-

"I wouldn't dream of contacting the royal family about private conversations," a palace spokesman said.

The Sun, quoting "a close friend of the royal family," said the queen was "deeply upset by criticism of the royal family because of the 47-year-old Margarets friendship with Llewellyn, 17 years her junior.
