## SOMETHING FOR JOEY

'Something for Joey,' the critically acclaimed true-life story of the close and loving relationship between Heisman Trophy winner John Cappelletti and his younger brother Joey, stricken with leukemia, will be rebroadcast Friday, Sept. 8.

Marc Singer stars as Cappelletti, who is now a running back for the Los Angeles Rams, and Jeff Lynas (pictured with Singer) stars as Joey. Also starring are Geraldine Page and Gerald S. O'Loughlin as the boys' parents.

'Something for Joey,' the recipient of a Christopher Award, was written and produced by Jerry McNeely and was directed by Lou Antonio. The film tells the story of the brothers' mutual admiration and love and examines how each inspired the other. John marveled at the courage constantly displayed by Joey and Joey worshipped John for his athletic abilities and brotherly devotion. The drama traces family events during the two years prior to the Heisman Trophy dinner and John's moving tribute to his brother Joey.

## MISS AMERICA PAGEANT



Three notable personalities closely identified with Miss America—Phyllis George, Lee Meriwether and Bert Parks—will be the co-hosts of the 58th annual Miss American Pageant, celebrating its 25th consecutive live telecast on NBC-TV on Saturday, Sept. 9.

The longest-running and most prestigious pageant, this year's event also will present Miss America of 1978 Susan Perkins (pictured), who will perform in the musical production, with the theme title of 'One More Time,' as well as crown her successor.

The 50 state representatives will travel to Atlantic City, N.J., to vie for the coveted title of Miss America of 1979. The winner will receive a \$20,000 scholarship award and also earn more than \$50,000 in public appearance fees during her year-long reign.
