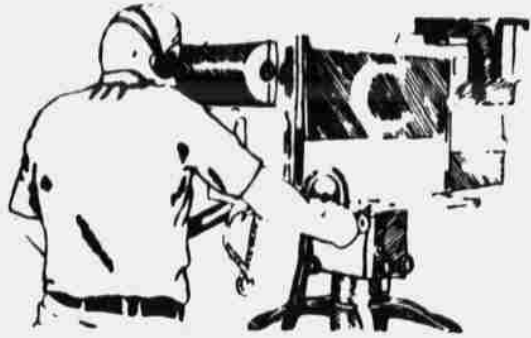

Just released from prison, his business cards barely dry, Martin ('Kaz') Kazinski (Ron Leibman, pictured) applies for a job with Samuel Bennett (Patrick O'Neal), the head of a prestigious law firm.

Sensing a unique quality in the gutsy, single-minded young man, Bennett is intrigued but not yet ready to risk the reputation of his well-established firm by hiring him. However, Bennett does use his considerable influence to throw a case Kaz's way—his first—to defend a black man charged with assault and robbery.

Kaz knows that he's expected to plea-bargain and dispense with a trial but he believes his client's claim that he's innocent.
