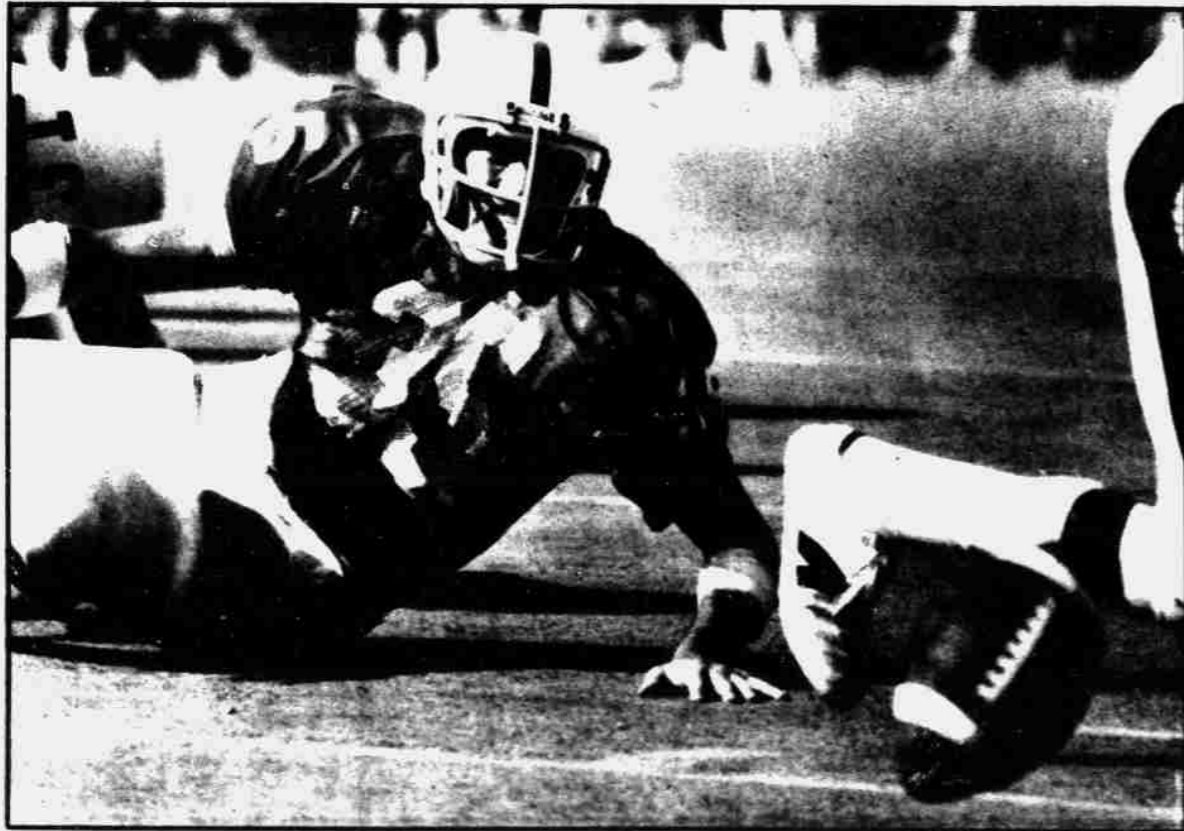
"We plan to shuffle our defensive line-men in and out a lot to keep them as fresh as possible," Van Zandt said.

Hipp, who holds Nebraska single game

and season rushing marks, will get his first chance to show his stuff in front of a home audience. Berns, Sorley, and Hipp will probably be joined in the backfield by wingback Kenny Brown. Anthony Steels will also see action in the wingback slot.

When quarterback Sorley goes to the air lanes he will be seeking out split ends Tim Smith and Frank Lockett, plus tight end Junior Miller. Against the Tide, Smith caught three passes for 18 yards, while Miller hauled in a pair for 13 yards.
