## Vandalism reported

University Police said Tuesday they still are investigating a case of vandalism at UNL's Swine Research Center, at 74th and Adams streets in northeast Lincoln.

Police said vandals broke into the three-story structure sometime between Sept. 27 and Oct. 4. The incident was reported Monday.

Police said once the vandals enter the building, they armed themselves with lead pipes they found in the building, and smashed 329 windows and most of the building's doors. In addition, 30 bushels of grain were dumped on the floor. Police said damage has been estimated at \$3,790.

Dr. Ernie Peo, professor of Animal Science, said the building was used only for storage. He said the building and surrounding property will be sold because it is no longer needed.
