

Professional hockey team loses first 'home' game here

The Sioux City Musketeers of the U.S. Hockey League came to Lincoln to play the first of six hockey games this year in Pershing Municipal Auditorium, but it was the Anoka Nordiques that delivered the winning punch.

The legendary Punch Fehringer did not score any goals or get credited with any assists, but the fiery skater did receive two five-minute major penalties for fighting and a game misconduct penalty.

A small crowd of about 600 saw Anoka defeat the Sioux City team 4-2 Sunday night. The six game series is an experiment

to see if Lincoln can support a professional hockey team. Omaha used to have a hockey team, the Omaha Knights, but it was abolished by the parent Atlanta Flames because it was not profitable.

Anoka took the early lead when they scored two goals in the first period. Keith Ballstad scored the first goal at 13:59 with assists by Bruce Norby and Keith Pauly. Kurt Madygra scored the second goal 38 seconds later with an assist from Phil Qualy.

In the second period, Anoka got its third goal when Joe Voyediech scored with assists by Pete Soterberg and Max Schelde.

After 29 minutes and 46 seconds of penalty-free hockey, Anoka got a two minute interference call. Sioux City's Les Batog then made the score 3-2 with a power-play goal.

Anoka finished the scoring by getting another goal from Ballstad at 18:30 in the third period.

Fehringer got involved in his first fight at 11:31 in the second period. Both he and his pugilistic opponent, Scott Steele received five minute penalties. Fehringer's second match was at the final buzzer where he and his opponent Dan Hoene drew five minute penalties and game misconducts.

In spite of some problems with the rink, the crowd was enthusiastic. The first period was stopped occasionally to repair the ice and the puck got stuck under the boards a number of times. The rink is 40 feet shorter than regulation size.

The Musketeers next game in Lincoln will be Nov. 12. It will be University of Nebraska night with lowered admission prices for students. The opponent will be from Bloomington, Minn.

Sioux City coach Andre Beaulieu was not happy with his team's performance, but he promised, "We will be better next time."

UNL graduate part of Health center resident's program

A UNL graduate is working at the University Health Center as part of the health center's new residents program.

Dr. Karen Martinson, who graduated from UNL in 1970 and from the University Medical Center in 1977, is the first resident in the program.

The program is a one-month rotation of second-and-third-year residents who have their medical degrees and have completed one year or residency, according to Dr.

Garland Bare, health center chief of staff.

The program was started to give med center students who work nights at the health center a better understanding of the continuity of health services offered by the health center, Martinson said.

Attention really needed

The med school also thought the type of patients at the health center would be good for the residents to see, Martinson said.

The fact that she is a pediatrician hasn't caused any problems in her health center

residency, she said.

"Many of the problems you find in the 12 through 16 age group are common in college students," she said.

One of the advantages she noticed is dealing with pregnancies and gynecological problems which she doesn't normally encounter as a pediatrician.

College-age patients

She said she enjoyed working at the health center and working with college-aged students.

"It's so different from your everyday

doctor situation," Martinson said, "because you see many more students than you would in regular practice.

She said most of the students she sees really do need the services of the health center. Because they are so busy with school, they only come when they really need medical attention, she said.

She said she didn't realize all the services the health center had to offer when she was a student, nor the savings in cost over other medical services from hospitals.
