

Orientation host search underway

During the month of November, student host positions with the new Student Orientation Program will be opening up.

Starting Nov. 6, the members of the Orientation Staff will begin a 3-month search for the 15 undergraduate students who can best represent UNL.

"Although the name is the same, the Student Host position will take on some added responsibilities this year," said Sandi Rhoten, CAP Program Consultant for New Student Orientation.

"With the formation of the Campus Activities and Programs Office, the Orientation Program is developing a larger year-round scope. We feel the benefits of orientation can reach beyond the first day of class to impact the new student throughout the whole first year."

Due to that year-round program concept, the Student Hosts will be hired for a one-year appointment, beginning in February and ending Jan. 30. During the Summer

Orientation Program, Student Hosts will be paid \$550 plus free room and board for six weeks of employment.

"Since our primary goal is to provide information and experiences to new UNL students and their parents," explained Gary Coleman, Orientation Graduate Assistant, "we want to make our services available in a number of ways. This will include a variety of orientation-related programs held throughout the school year."

Applications for the Student Host positions are at the Dean's Office of each undergraduate college: CAP, Nebraska Union; CAP-East, East Union, and the UNL Cultural Center. The closing date for the applications is Thursday, Nov. 30.

Prospective Host applicants are encouraged to attend one of three information meetings that will be 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 8 in the East Union; 3:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 14 or 7 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 16 in the Nebraska Union. Former Student Hosts and the orientation staff will be present at these meetings to explain the duties of the Host position and answer any applicant's questions.

Once applications have been completed, they will be screened at the individual college level. Finalists, picked by the colleges, will then be interviewed by a seven person selection committee in January. The new Student Host Staff should be in operation by Feb. 1.

The Undergraduate Sociology Association will meet at 12:30 p.m. Tuesday in Oldfather 722.

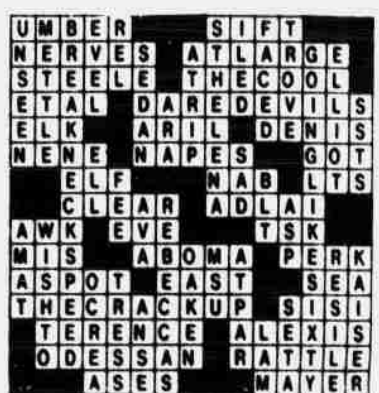
The UNL Amateur Radio Club will meet at 4 p.m. Tuesday in Bancroft Hall 312.
