The cost of the buttons is \$1 and they will be sold at a booth in the Nebraska Union and at basketball games.

"The singers have worked real hard all semester and I'm really glad they will be able to go to the Orange Bowl," Hengen said. "It will be a nice reward for them to be able to perform at more glamorous places."





Mueller's annual Christmas show starts this week


Beginning this week, the Mueller Planetarium will present its annual Christmas show, the "Star of Bethlehem."


This story of the Christmas nearly 2,000 years ago will alternate on weekends with the current planetarium program "Laser: The Light Fantastic."


