

Women's status to be studied

Finding out what UNL women think of their jobs is one of the objectives of the Chancellor's Commission on the Status of Women outlined last week, according to the commission chairperson.

Meeting with women faculty, administrators, and students last Wednesday, commission members discussed goals formulated last semester.

The nine-member commission, which includes faculty members, students, administrators, and staff workers, acts as an advisory group to the chancellor.

Commission chairperson Patricia Knaub said the commission is interested in collecting demographic information on UNL women, and then developing a questionnaire "to see how they perceive themselves... and their status."

The commission may use the information collected to suggest improvements in UNL policies, Knaub said.

Other commission goals Knaub identified include checking to see that the campus has no discriminatory practices that violate Title IX, and recognizing the accomplishments of UNL women.

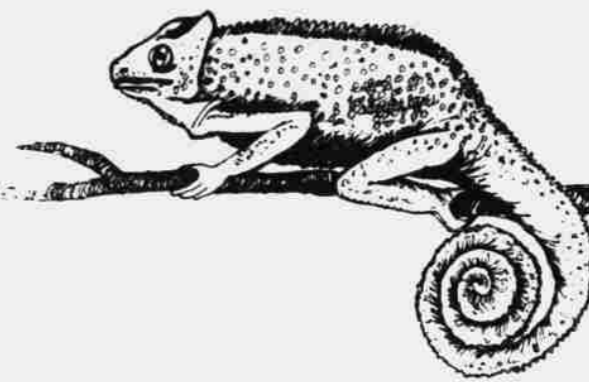
Robert Rutford, vice chancellor for research and graduate studies, UNL will speak on "Research Oppor-

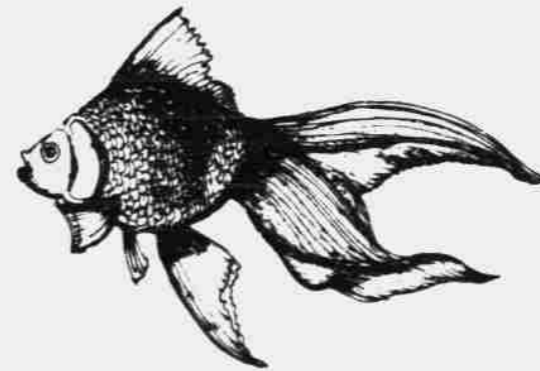
