

Bennett receives extended medical leave of absence

The medical leave of absence granted to Nebraska Union Director Allen Bennett in February has been extended by Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs Richard Armstrong.

Armstrong said he has extended Bennett's leave 90 more days on the recommendation of the director's physician.

Bennett was scheduled to return to his position after March 1. Armstrong said Bennett now will return at the end of May or the beginning of June.

However, he may return sooner if his physician recommends it, said Daryl Swanson, associate director of the union and Nebraska East Union manager.

Swanson said in February that Bennett's health

problem was stress related. He told the *Daily Nebraskan* that Bennett has had a history of stress related problems.

Appointed by Armstrong, Swanson is acting as the director of the unions. Swanson appointed Dean Young, Food Service manager of the east union.

The union will continue to run as usual without Bennett, Armstrong said.

The union management and the Union Board will continue to review recommendations made in the Touche-Ross report, Swanson said. The Touche-Ross report is an audit that discusses union problems and recommends changes to solve them.

The results of the student survey conducted by Selec-

tion Research Inc. will be the Union Board's next major project, Swanson said.

The survey is being conducted to find out how the students feel about the union and is expected to be presented to UNL officials April 2, Swanson said.

He added that the survey then will be given to the Union Board. Swanson said the board then will use the survey to make changes that the students want.

Summer correction

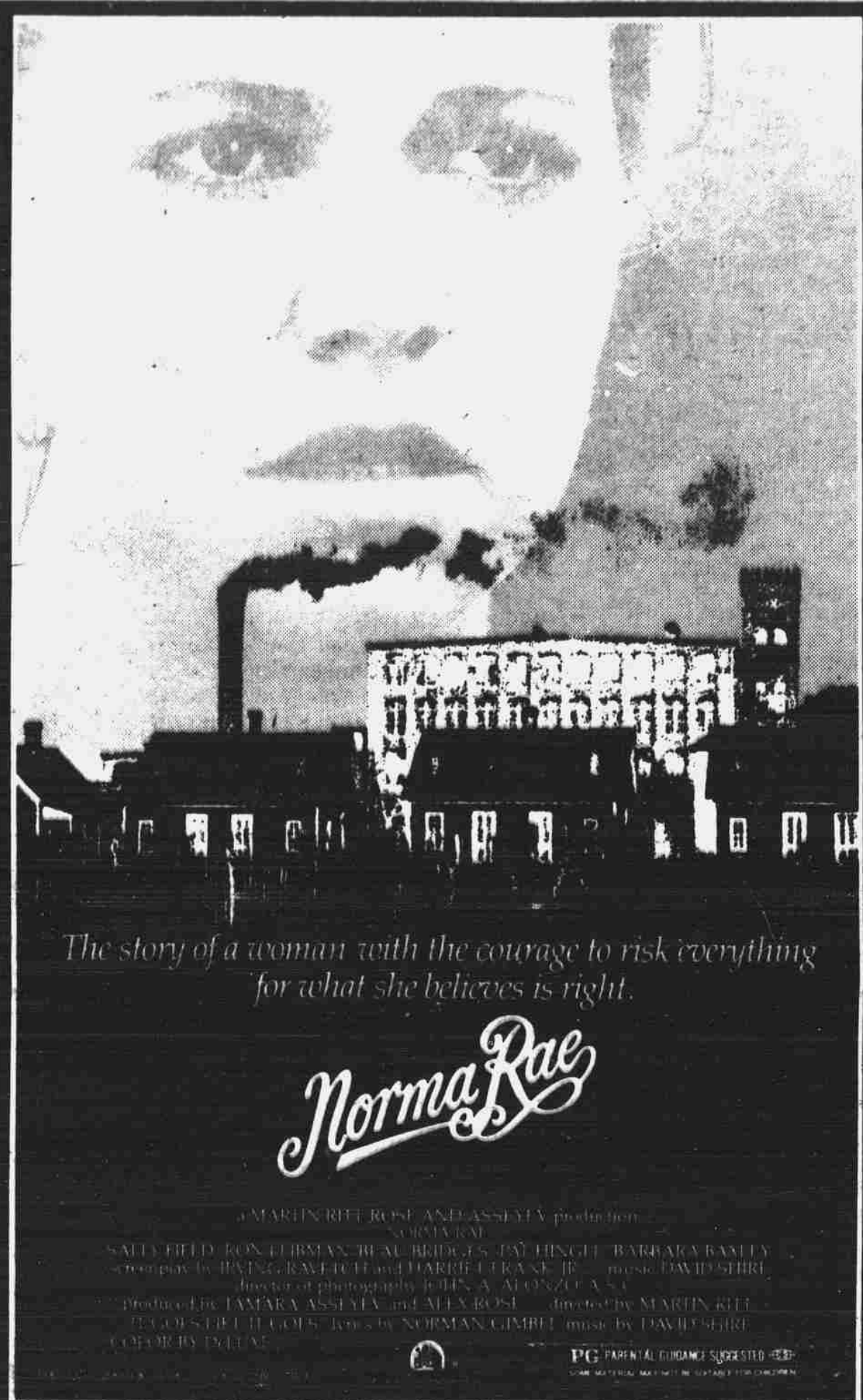
