

Regents to reconsider open admissions policy Saturday

The NU Board of Regents Saturday will discuss regent Robert Simmons' proposal that the university drop its open admissions policy.

The regents asked NU officials last month to bring alternative admissions plans to Saturday's meeting. Standards have been suggested that would admit students on the basis of class rank, grades, and/or ACT or SAT scores.

The UNL Faculty Senate has passed a resolution recommending "in the strongest possible terms that the traditional policy of open admissions be continued."

The administration, however, will not recommend any action to the regents Saturday, according to Ned Hedges, UNL vice chancellor for academic affairs.

The board will also consider a recommendation to place the UNL-based Dental College under the administrative control of the Medical Center in Omaha.

The board's Academic and Business Affairs committees will meet at 9 a.m., and the formal meeting will start at 1:30 p.m.

Other items on the agenda include:

-Discussion of NU's compliance with new federal retirement laws which become effective in 1982.

-A proposal to limit the number of football tickets allowed each regent.

-Approval of four contracts with Ozark Airlines for the Football Traveling Squad, for the 1979 football season, in the amount of \$50,516.

-Approval of investing up to \$40,000 of non-university program facilities fee deposits, held by the office of Student Activities and Financial Services, into the ASUN Credit Union.

-Expenditure of \$72,712 for refurbishing hotel rooms and corridors in the Nebraska Center.

-Approval of the preliminary drawings for the 9,000 seat stadium addition, which will cost up to \$5.1 million.

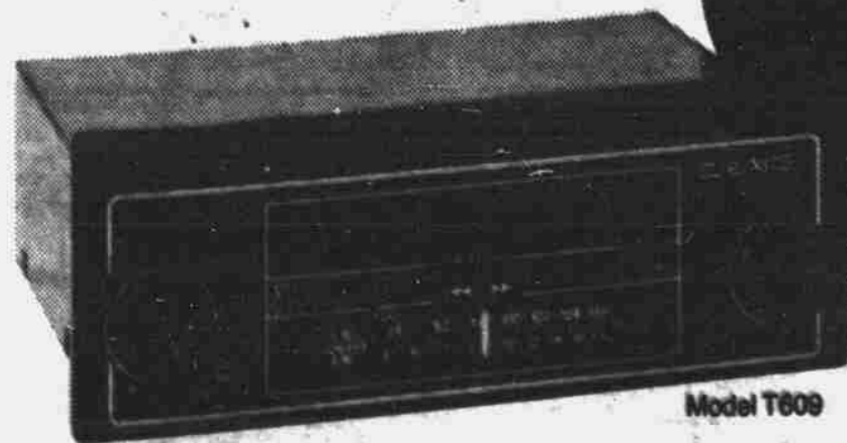
