Although Gardner said his future is uncertain and the chances of returning to his project are slim, Vickers said he would approach the NPPD Board of Directors.

"He might not be right with everything he's saying, but his intentions are pure," said Vickers adding that, he was suspicious when Gardner first approached him.

"He has nothing to gain and is possibly

losing his job, career, and has been moved from his family which are still in Sutherland," Vickers said.

Gardner said he hopes the Attorney General will be able to clarify the matter within two weeks.

"I know they (ratepayers) are getting ripped off," he said. "I'm going to do what I think is right, even if that's going to cost me my job. And I believe it may already cost me my job."
