

Publications board raises paper's editorial salaries

Michael Zangari was appointed *Daily Nebraskan* ombudsman for the fall semester and full-time employees, editor-in-chief and advertising manager salaries were set by the UNL Publications Board Thursday night.

Zangari, a junior journalism major from Satellite Beach, Fla., has served as reporter, columnist and entertainment editor at the *Daily Nebraskan*.

The *Daily Nebraskan* editor's salary was set by the board at \$600 per month, a 32 percent increase from the \$450 the editor is currently paid.

Business Manager Jerri Haussler and fall semester Editor In Chief Amy Lenzen explained the increase as necessary as the *Daily Nebraskan* will be publishing five days a week in the fall, requiring an increased responsibility for the editor.

However, board member John Kreuscher objected to the increase and proposed that the salary be set at \$500 per month and 10 percent of money for editorial salaries be cut from the budget.

Both Kreuscher proposals failed and on 2-5 votes.

Advertising manager Denise Jordan, who is returning for her second year in the position, received a 43 percent increase in salary from \$350 per month to \$500 per month.

The motion Kreuscher offered in approving the increase justified the jump in salary because Jordan will be working nearly full time as advertising manager. She

also receives a commission on all ads.

Haussler asked the board for a salary increase from \$10,000 to \$11,250, a 12.5 percent increase for 25 hr. work week.

Following a closed session, the board offered her \$11,000 for the ten-month, five-hour day position.

Production manager Kitty Policky asked the board for increase to \$14,000 from \$11,287.50, the increase based partially on the extra day of publication.

Policky was offered \$12,500 by the board, but board Chairman Mark Bowen and Policky agreed to further negotiate the figure with the board's executive committee.
