# Colleagues choose Allen, Schalk as coaches of year

After a year when the sport of gymnastics reached new heights in Nebraska, head coaches Francis Allen and Judy Schalk were appropriately named Men's and Women's Coach of the year by their colleagues Thursday.

In telephone polling by the Daily Nebraskan each coach was allowed one vote for the men's sports and one for the women's sports. And although all but three of 13 coaches were reached, there were clearcut winners for both awards.

Allen, whose gymnasts captured the school's first ever NCAA champsionship,

garnered five more votes than his nearest competitor, baseball coach John Sanders. The only other coach receiving a vote was head football coach Tom Osborne.

Schalk's female gymnasts also qualified for the nationals and finished in a tie for 11th at the AIAW championships at Penn State University.

She edged women's softball coach Don Isherwood, whose team won the Nebraska state softball title last weekend.

Volleyball coach Terry Pettit, and basketball coach Lorrie Gallagher also received votes. Pettit's team won another Big Eight Championship and Gallagher's squad won 22 games while qualifying for regionals

Allen and Schalk have both been busy in the off-season.

Schalk is in Pennsylvania this weekend with all-arounder Patty Carmichael, who is competing in the World University Games Trials.

Allen accompanied all-arounder Jim Hartung to an East Germany meet two weeks ago and last weekend took Hartung and three teammates to the AAU Senior National Gymnastics Championships in Houston, Texas.

And both Allen and Schalk have a good nucleus back for next season.

Schalk lost all-arounder Peggy Liddick

to graduation but returns Patty Carmichael, Crissy Robertson and freshman Renee Reisdorff.

All-American Larry Gerard graduates from Allen's squad along with Kirk Fridrich, Terry Nowels, Steve Parks and Steve Todd.

But Hartung and a host of other talent returns, including highly recruited Phil Cahoy from Omaha South High School.

While gymnastics increased in popularity in 1979 and drew crowds of up to 4,000 people in Lincoln, 1980 looks like it may be an even better year, especially with the NCAA Championships in Lincoln next April.
