## Evans Dance Company to perform Saturday A dance workshop, graduate and Sanwick called the E

A dance workshop, featuring members of the Bill Evans Dance Company, will be offered at UNL June 10-29.

The workshop will combine the participants of the Nebraska Dance workshop, and the annual All-State Fine Arts Program, which will meet for two weeks, according to Marie Sanwick, workshop coordinator.

Sanwick said this is the first year an entire company has come for the workshop, which is in its third year. In the past, nationally-known teachers have come for the workshop, but not an entire company, Sanwick said.

About 60 to 70 students will participate in the workshop, Sanwick said, adding that the size is "absolutely perfect" since the group will be divided by technical skill levels.

"We have people come from all across the country," Sanwick said, indicating that workshop participants would be coming from California to Philadelphia, and would include faculty from other universities.

The workshop, which will be offered for both graduate and undergraduate credit, will be a "concentrated performance clinic," according to Sanwick, and will feature ballet, modern, and jazz dance, with company members teaching different forms.

Faculty for the workshop will be Gregg Lizenbery and Debbie Paulsen, both performers for the Evans Company, Pamela Heston, a dancer with the Omaha Ballet, and Barbara Bach Mason, a faculty member at UNI.

The Evans Company will be in residence for the workshop June 14-16, and will perform a variety of activities, Sanwick said.

On June 14, Evans will narrate a performance of his company, which will be open to the public in Mabel Lee Hall, Sanwick said.

Members of the company will instruct dance technique classe on June 15, Sanwick said. Sanwick said there will be an improvisitation class, a repertory class, and a musical, comedy, and tap class.

On June 16 there will be a formal performance by the Evans Company at Kimball Hall. Sanwick called the Evans Company "one of the most popular companies in the country," and said that they have been popular for about the last six years.

Sanwick also called the companies' work "very exciting" and said they were very fortunate to get the company to Lincoln for the workshop.

Sanwick said the arrangements to have the Evans Company were made over a year in advance.

The Evans Company is based in Seattle, where they rehearse, conduct home performances, and are now developing a curriculum for dance students at Dance Theatre Seattle, the official company school.

The Evans Repertory company reflects a philosophy of movement and dance concerned with human communication.

Bill Evans, director of the company, is the recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship and fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts.

As a teacher, Evans has been on the faculty of the University of Utah, and the Harvard University Dance Center.
