WHEN YOU DIAL 911 WE MOVE FAST!

Dial 911 when there's a serious emergency, accident or heart attack. It's the best way there is to get help. Fast! When you dial 911 your call goes to the 911 communications center of the County City Building where trained dispatchers take your call. The nearest ambulance, law enforcement and fire units will all respond to you call during a life threatening emergency.

When you call, remain calm when the operator answers. Tell what the emergency is and where it has occurred. Then stay on the line while you are switched over to the proper agency to relate further details.

That's where we come in. We're part of the 911 team. We see to it that once you call received, we respond quickly. (The Lincoln area mobile heart team based at Union Hospital responds to medical emergencies in its service area 24 hours a day.)

Remain calm when using 911. Remember to use 911 only for emergencies and use it when you need help. Fast!

No coin is needed when dialing "911" from a pay phone.
