Dority says his wife and five children "don't think I'm a lot different," and that his children used to "play blind"

with his cane. He has been a frequent "show and tell" project for his children, with their prompting grade school teachers, he added.

Dority has many favorite anecdotes. Like the one about the blind guy who challenged Bob Hope to a golf match, at his country club, at midnight. . Or the airplane

pilot who was walking Ray Charles' guide dog, as Charles pointed him out to a worried passenger. Dority said one of his standard favorites is telling a sighted person "You people are handicapped in the dark."

Walking around town, with his white cane, Dority said he "listens to the patterns of sounds", something anyone

could learn to do. He denies the theory that blind people can hear better, saying it is a matter of having to pay more attention.

Dority listens to the patterns of sound to tune his pianos and to make his way through life. He said he'll

keep working as long as he has his health, and as long as the public hires him.

The reason that this has to be done almost immediately is that the longer we wait into the semester to decide, the less the amount of savings will be from our possible cuts," Bob Moline, secretary of Union Board.

"We want campus feedback on this situation." Kreuscher said, "If students feel as strong about this as they have about other things, then Union hours probably won't be cut."

Swanson said that the board will meet with the Committee on Fee Allocations Tuesday to see if there are any other feasible areas for reduction.

"There is a bill of intent for the Legislature now to not fund utilities the same as last year," Swanson said. "So we are looking for long term cost reduction areas, not just for this one year."




