

# Nebraska knocked off in marathon volleyball match

It seemed more like a marathon than a volleyball tournament Saturday when second-seeded Southwest Missouri State knocked off top seeded Nebraska 15-7, 14-16, 12-15, 15-11, 15-10 for the AIAW (Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) Region VI championship and a berth in the AIAW national meet in Carbondale, Ill. Dec. 5-8.

It took two matches and nearly four hours for the Bears to defeat the Huskers in the double-elimination tournament which saw Nebraska battle their way through the losers' bracket and fall just short in their comeback bid.

The Huskers had defeated Kansas 15-11, 18-16, 15-6

and Kansas State 15-12, 15-10, 10-15, 15-5 in the winners' bracket before losing in the winners' bracket finals to Southwest Missouri State 15-12, 11-15, 15-10, 15-10 Friday night.

Saturday, the Huskers defeated Minnesota in a losers' bracket match 15-2, 10-15, 15-11, 15-12 to advance into the finals against the Bears. Nebraska then forced the second match by beating the Bears 5-15, 15-9, 15-10, 15-13.

UNL volleyball coach Terry Pettit said he wasn't disappointed with his team's performance.

"I think we played well," Pettit said. "We dug ourselves a hole when we lost Friday night and just fell a little short trying to come back."

"I don't feel bad. If they (our players) had any less

character, they wouldn't have gotten as far as they did."

Pettit said the fact that the Huskers had to play one more match than the Bears Saturday may have caused some mental fatigue for his team down the stretch, but he had compliments for the champions.

"They're a very good team," Pettit said. "You play well in the pressure when you play good defense like they do and that will help them in nationals. They will represent the region well."

Two Huskers, sophomore Terri Kanouse and senior Nancy Grant were named to the all-tournament team.

"Terri pretty much dominated the tournament," Pettit said. "It didn't matter if the set was good or bad during the tournament, she put it away. She's a tremendous player."

The Huskers, now 41-8-3, are through for the season unless they receive one of the three at-large bids given for the national meet. Pettit said he didn't know the chances of the Huskers receiving an at-large bid.

Even if the Huskers do not get an at-large berth, Pettit said this team is still the best he's coached at Nebraska.

"I don't think any team less than this one could have done what was done today," Pettit said.

Carol Hall and Sherry Hayward broke individual marks and the 400 freestyle relay team of Hall, Marla Thomson, Ann Kennedy and Rene Sullivan posted a time of 4:40.29, breaking the previous record of 4:40.80.

Hall won the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:10.30, snapping Melanie Jakob's old mark of 1:10.92. Hayward captured the 400 individual medley in a record time of 4:40.09.
