

Thone declares April 19-26 as state's Women's Week

Gov. Charles Thone last week declared April 19-26 Women's Week for Nebraska. The move was prompted by the urging of the UNL Women's Resource Center, according to Marcee Metzger of the Center.

The week begins with a Pro-Choice March and Rally. Pro-Choice groups advocated the freedom to decide whether or not to have abortions. The march starts at 11 a.m. at the State Capitol where several speakers, including state senators, will address the issue of abortion rights.

Singer-songwriter Holly Near will be in concert 8 p.m. Sunday in the Nebraska Union's Centennial Room. Near's music concerns peace, culture and feminism, according to the Center. The latest of her four record albums is "Imagine my Surprise," voted best album of the year by the National Association of Independent Record Distributors.

Former political prisoner

Featured Women's Week speaker is Ginetta Sagan who will talk April 22 on "International Affairs and Human Rights: One Woman's View." According to the Center, Sagan began her support for human rights as a non-violent worker in the Italian and French resistance of World War II. Currently associated with Amnesty International and Humanitas, groups working for individual freedoms, Sagan was once a political prisoner.

An April 21 Women's Resource Center open house is scheduled for 1 to 4 p.m. at which a video tape on Willa Cather will be shown. For women only will be a women's self-health workshop at 7 p.m. and a pre-

sentation on "Lesbianism and Feminism" by the Lincoln Legion of Lesbians at 7:30 p.m. April 21.

In addition to Sagan's lecture April 22, a panel discussion on "Women in Athletics" is planned from 1 to 2:30 p.m. At 8 p.m. there will be a filmstrip on the National Organization of Women; membership information will be available.

Rape prevention workshops

Women/Speak features associate professors of English Hortense Spillers and Moira Ferguson on "Women's Literature and Women's Studies" at 12:30 p.m. April 23.

Tim Snyder will present two rape and assault prevention workshops on April 23 at 3 p.m. and April 24 at 7 p.m.

Teresa Lafromboise, assistant professor of educational psychology and measurements, will speak on "Native American Women's Roles" April 23.

A slide show on 12 women will be shown at 7 p.m. and a "Men's Awareness Workshop" will be 7 p.m. April 23, followed by a lecture on "Planning a Verbal Presentation."

The Rape and Spouse-Center will sponsor a lecture and discussion on sexual assault from 1 to 2 p.m. April 24, followed by a lecture on domestic violence from 2 to 3 p.m. sponsored by the Abuse Crisis Center.

"Women against Pornography," a slide show, will be presented at 8 p.m.

Sandi Hanisko will talk about "Skills for Delivering Presentations" from 1 to 3 p.m. April 24.




