"When we first became roommates, he played some Chilean music. It was fine for a while, but too much exposure to it would drive me wacky," he said.


Humor has crept into their relationship continually over the past two years.

But Daniel thought something else he learned was quite important.


"One of the things I am grateful to Mike for, is that he made me realize how good beer tastes."
