UNL students get Vreeland awards

Vreeland Awards for excellence in their creative fields were presented to UNL students Friday afternoon in Sheldon Art Gallery.

Art awards of \$540 each went to Pairaj Tangsritrakul of Bangkok, Thailand, Robert Radek of Lincoln and R. Craig Roper of Lincoln. Recipients of \$380 English awards were Elizabeth A. Banset of Lincoln, Ann Bardens Herbener of Lincoln and Judith Somberger of Lincoln. Brett Holihan, of Mukwonago, Wis., Christopher Hopkins of Oriza Vista, Calif., and Mark Bruckner of Lincoln received \$380 music awards.

Tangsritrakul is a Master of Fine Arts candidate specializing in pottery, ceramics, sculpture, drawing and painting.

Rader is from Geneva but has lived in Lincoln for 11 years. He plans to do graduate work at the University of Washington at Seattle.

Roper plans to spend some time in New York, Philadelphia and Albuquerque before considering post-graduation plans.

Banset is a poet who is doing graduate work in creative writing. She expects to have a book-length manuscript ready soon.

Somberger is also a poet who is studying creative writing while working in the office of the Dean of Arts and Sciences at UNL and teaching writing at the Lincoln Correctional Center.

Herbener also writes poetry and prose, which she is combining into a book. She is also doing graduate work at UNL.

Bruckner has a double major in music and English, and his interests are in writing both literature and music.

Hopkins, a cellist and conductor with performing credentials from Lincoln and his native California, is a graduate student in music composition.

Holihan, a native of Ohio who earned a music history and theory degree at the University of Wisconsin, is also studying composition at UNL.

The Latter Day Saint Student Association will meet today at noon in the CAP room of the East Union.


