I explained that operating expenses were increased 10 percent this year, but because of a deficit that required an emergency 15 percent cut in operating ex-

penses, we had 5 percent less available this year.

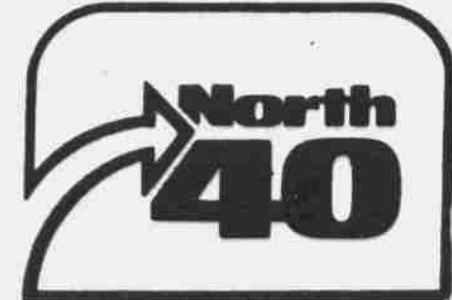

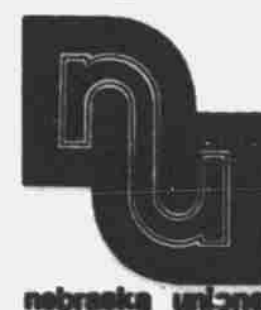
