The resolution further stated that ASUN would advocate increased funding to support expansion of ethnic and women studies courses.

A variety of different courses are offered under women and ethnic studies, as the two areas are not classes themselves, according to Senate members.


The Senate heard from a member of the Chicano graduate Studies Association supporting the resolution. Dolores Cardona said requiring students to take the

courses would be "economically sound because a lot of jobs require the ability to get along with other people."

She said the courses would increase understanding of minority problems, adding that students with a broader base of understanding become "more marketable."

Doreen Charles, president of the African Peoples Union agreed.

"This is concerned with every day living," Charles said. "You can't say you've learned this or that in the



different colleges, if you can't deal with people outside your culture," she said.

Some senators opposed adopting the resolution because it did not specify the procedure by which the courses would become requirements.


