She said they were disgusted that this type of incident could happen at UNL.

"We're indignant that anybody could downgrade the university the way it has been," she said. "It makes the university look bad."

"Freedom of speech can go too far at times."

Mrs. Coe concluded that she didn't want to say anything about the lawsuits before consulting their attorney. "We don't want to say anything we shouldn't that

might end up jeopardizing the case," she said. Coe's attorney, Robert Creager, said that although he received the letter from Coe requesting that some course of action be pursued, he first has to talk to Coe about

"specifics." Creager said he already has done research on all aspects of the case but it is up to Coe to decide who he files against and for what reasons. He said he wouldn't comment on his recommendations until after he has talked

to Coe. "I've done the research though and once I find out what he (Coe) wants it wouldn't take long to get a petition in to get into court," Creager said.

Although Creager said he wouldn't say what all the legal possibilities are he did say that his research did include Sen. Chambers.

"Mr. Coe hasn't excluded the possibility of action

against Senator Chambers to my knowledge," Creager said. "If there is a lawsuit against Chambers it would probably be separate though."


Creager also said that although Coe had not requested anything about the papers that used quotes from the letter, he had also done research on that aspect.
