Freese said in addition to providing the chance to acquire good ideas in leadership skills, the seminar will also direct emphasis on leadership at an individual's own level.

Program highlights include "Looking at Self in Preparation for Leadership," "Developing Effective Leadership within the Organization and the Institute," and "Using Leadership Skills at the Local Level."

Freese said program speakers will feature Lois Olive, clinical psychologist and visiting professor at UNL's Human Development and the Family Department, Burl Winchester, professor of Adult Education and Human Development at Montana State University; and Roger Sandman, director of Intergovernmental Affairs, Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C.

Freese said Olive has served as a vocational consultant for the U.S. Department of Health, Education andWelfare, and that Winchester has a national reputation as a consultant and workshop director in the areas of communica. tions, motivation and leadership.

Sandman taught Vocational Agriculture at Wood River and served former Gov. J. James Exon as Deputy Secretary of Agriculture.
