Fund A refunds cut services cedure to determine its effectiveness, she said.

Students who apply for Fund A student fee refunds will not be eligible for certain services from the organizations that use such fees, ASUN President Renee Wessels said.

A policy enacted last May by the NU Board of Regents stated that students are required to pay Fund A fees, each s⁻ ster, but can apply for and receive a refund on those tees. The refund for the entire Fund A portion of the fees is \$3.33.

The campus organizations that use Fund A fees are ASUN, the Daily Nebraskan and the University Program Council.

Wessels said that students can get refunds from any or all of those groups.

Services that cannot be obtained by students receiving Fund A refunds are free legal services from ASUN, a student discount on classified ads from the Daily Nebraskan, Free University classes, major speakers, films, performing arts programs and coffeehouses sponsored by UPC, student-priced tickets for films, Model United Nations delegate fees and UPC concerts, dances, trips, contests and tournaments.

"We are concerned that students fully understand what they are giving up," Wessels said. "We (the student organiations) want to provide the service and representation students want," she said.

Wessels said she hopes students will approach fee-using organizations with any questions or suggestions they might have.

ASUN is attaching a questionnaire to all Fund A refund forms to find out why students are asking for the refunds.

Freshmen eligible for RHA positions

Freshmen are now eligible to run for executive office in the Residence Hall Association, after the passage of an amendment to the bylaws.

Article 4, Section 3A of the bylaws, which previously required any candidate for RHA executive office to have lived in a residence hall for one year, now requires one semester of residence hall living.

Applications for executive and representative positions are available this week in the RHA office at the Neihardt Residence Center. They must be filed with Election Commissioner John Folda by March 1, and elections will be March 4.

RHA approved the 1982 housing budget submitted by Housing Director Doug Zatechka at the previous meeting.

Rick Schmid, rate study chairman, will prepare a report containing his committee's opinion of the budget and suggested cuts for next year's rate study.

Members also voted to allocate \$400 of conference committee funds toward sending representatives to both the regional and national conferences of the Association of College and University Residence Halls.

Former Harper Hall representative John Folda is serving as RHA vice president for the rest of this term. Former Vice President Lisa Burianek resigned to take an intern




