If I were on this Core Committee, I would welcome interest on SSA whether it be pro or con. This opposition should prove to both the Core Committee and ASUN that students do care how their student fees are being spent.

The answer to this question is for the students to decide, not ASUN. The petitions only show one side of the issue. The students opposing SSA need to have a means to express their opinion. The only logical and democratic thing to do is to let the students vote on

a referendum in the March 4 ASUN elections. If the Core Committee and ASUN think this is something that important, then they should let the students vote.

The time is now for students to show concern. Ask now for a referendum.

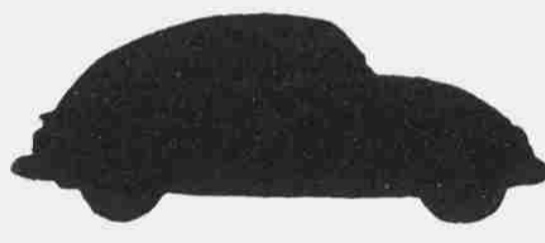
