Union Board rechristens 'The Crib' 'Union Square'

The Crib was officially rechristened Wednesday during a meeting of the Union Board.

'Union Square' will be the new name of the restaurant when it re-opens next January after an eight-month renovation beginning at the end of this semester.

"The Square gives an open motif to decor," said board member Larry Nagaki.

"A definite feeling can be incorporated from this name," he said.

Union Director Daryl Swanson, who favored the new name from the start,

said that with the various name suggestions students offered, five requests came for the name to remain unchanged.

Nagaki added that because of a high turnover of students, the new name will be something freshmen can identify with.

Some other suggestions were "Re-Union," "The U-Joint," "Dave Hardy Lunchroom," "Roxy," "The Unyum," and "The Briefeater."

In other business, the board voted 9 to 5 to approve a bylaws change in the UPC Culture Center's membership selection process.

The change will replace the requirement that four persons from each minority group on campus be a part of the Culture Center membership.

Positions applied for will now consist of interested students from each of the minority groups who file an application and go through an interview. The change also requires that the special events chairmen be a black, a Chicano, and a Native American student.

Although the motion passed, the board was confused about the statement's wording, and Program Activities Committee chairperson Molly Platter was told to obtain another statement from members of UPC's Culture Center.

Board members LaVern Hagem, Lane Handke, Dan Bigbee, Steve Hardy, Gary Hoover and Platter will be on the UPC interviewing committee.

Swanson said that as of March 1, the union's utilities were metered for the first time. Swanson referred to it as a mixed blessing.

"This makes us more accountable for our own utilities, and more careful with our own budget," he said. "But if the union is to be held responsible for its own utilities, it may cause an increase in the student fees we'll need."

The university formerly paid the utility bill, Swanson said.
