**Proxmire to speak
on government waste**

Sen. William Proxmire of Wisconsin, famous for giving his annual "Golden Fleece" award for what he considers the most wasteful government-funded projects, will speak on that topic Sunday at 7:30 p.m. in the Nebraska Union.

Proxmire's speech, entitled "Governmental Waste in America," will be followed by a question-and-answer session. The speech is sponsored by the Talks and Topics Committee of the University Program Council.

Proxmire has been in politics since 1950, when he was elected to the Wisconsin State Assembly. He has been a U.S. senator since 1957, when he won a

special election to fill the seat vacated by the death of Sen. Joseph McCarthy.

Since April of 1966, Proxmire has not missed a single roll call vote in the senate, out of a total of more than 7,000 such votes.

Proxmire, a graduate of Harvard University and the author of five books, is the ranking minority member of the Senate Appropriations Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs and the Congressional Joint Economic committee.
