

# United Nations Day, Nebraska prairie week proclaimed by Thone

Gov. Charles Thone signed two proclamations Tuesday — one designating Oct. 24 as United Nations Day and another marking the week of Oct. 18 through 25 as Nebraska Prairie Appreciation Week.

A press release from Ernest Rousek of the Wachiska Audubon Society said that educational packets dealing with prairies and their importance will be distributed to schools and youth groups throughout the week. Tours of the Nine Mile Prairie, a Wildlife Art Display and a prairie transplant party are planned.

Among the events, which will be free and open to the public, will be a display at Morrill Hall of native plants and recipes for local edible plants.

A Prairie/Plains Resource Institute press release said the purpose of the celebration was to increase public awareness about the danger of the vanishing prairie. It will also help to locate and map both public properties and preserved private properties that include native prairie grasses such as big and little bluestem, Indian grass, cordgrass, switchgrass and side oats grass.

### United Nations

United Nations Day is designed to introduce high school participants to U.N. procedures and to give the ruling council some experience to improve the weekend-long Model United Nations in March, according to secretary-general of the Model U.N. Howard Dickerson.

"This is designed to give everyone an idea of what will be going on," Dickerson said.

The events for United Nations Day will actually begin Oct. 23 with the selection of a security council. On Oct. 24 Nebraska Wesleyan University will sponsor three workshops featuring William Powers, director of Water Resources Center at UNL; a discussion on U.S.-China relations with Susan Rigdon of the UNL Political Science Department; and Mari Diaz, state coordinator for refugee affairs, who will talk on world refugee crisis in international law.

A banquet at the Nebraska Center for Continuing Education will feature Nebraska Chief Justice Norman Krivosha, who will speak on "The Need for World Recognition of Rule and Law."

### Regional conference

The Model U.N. is a regional conference that brings together college- and high school-age students who assume the roles and positions of countries in the actual United Nations, and argue those roles during the course of the conference. The theme for the March 3 through 6 conference is "Peace-It-Together," and the keynote speaker will be Donald F. McHenry, who assumed Andrew Young's position as United Nation's U.S. representative after

Young's resignation. Sonya Fidler, United Nations Association representative, said enthusiasm about the United Nations has picked up since the Model United Nations began.

"This is just to make people aware that the U.N. is still working to preserve and to improve the quality of life," she said.

Fidler said issues likely to be discussed at the conference include the Middle East, nuclear proliferation, political security and social humanitarianism.

Dickerson said the conference usually hosts 500 delegates and 250 to 300 of these are from UNL. Those wishing to be delegates can pick up applications at the UPC office beginning Oct. 28.
