Brisch is candidate for executive post

James Raglin, NU director of public affairs, has confirmed that Hans Brisch, associate NU executive vice president and provost, is a candidate for the presidency of Western Washington University, in Bellingham, Wash.

He received his bachelor's degree in political science from Park College in Kansas City, Mo., in 1964, a master's degree in 1967 and his doctorate in 1970 from the University of Kansas.

Graduate grants available

New program to aid mentally ill

Students interested in working with the chronically mentally ill may qualify for a grant in a graduate study program offered in this course of study. The UNL department of human development and the family recently has received a grant from the federal government to help in developing a new profession in this area, a UNL professor said.

Lois Schwab, a professor in the rehabilitation services section in the department of human development and the family, said UNL received the grant from the Rehabilitation Services Administration in the U.S. Education Department. The grant's purpose is to help train students

at the master's level so that more individuals will be available to work with people who are chronically mentally ill.

"Those persons in the institutions could live more freely in the community if there were a greater percentage of personnel," Schwab said. "There are 47,000 individuals in Nebraska who are in institutions. It is less expensive

to have them in the community than an institution."

The people who would be integrated into the community are those said to be stable enough to live there and who would progress more outside of an institution.

The grant, titled "Transitional Living Programs for the Chronically Mentally Ill," is part of a new government program to develop a profession in this area, Schwab said.

Seven trainee spots are available. Trainees will start on Jan. 10, Schwab said. The positions will last two years and pay \$316 per month plus tuition and fees.

The areas to be studied are: human development, family theories, rehabilitation procedures, abnormal psychology, counseling psychology and supervised field placements.
