Event urges smokers to quit

The Great American Smokeout, an effort of good nature to encourage smokers to give up cigarettes for 24 hours, will be next Thursday.

The nationwide event is sponsored by the American Cancer Society, but thousands of other organizations, businesses and hospitals join the effort.

The 1982 goal of the smokeout is to get at least one if every five smokers to give up smoking from midnight Wednesday to midnight Thursday. The Great American Smokeout is now in its sixth consecutive year as a nationwide celebration.

A booth in the Nebraska Union will offer chewing gum and lollipops to people giving up smoking, according to a Lincoln ACS spokesperson. To raise money for the society, members of the Sigma Nu fraternity and the Alpha Chi Omega sorority will run to Iowa State University in Ames for Saturday's NU-ISU football game.

In 1981, according to a survey conducted by the Gallup organization, just over 16 million American smokers attempted to give up cigarettes on the Smokeout Day.
