Baritone Brandstetter sings classical works

One of America's top young baritones will sing tonight in Kimball Recital Hall at 8. John Brandstetter, a native of Wayne and a UNL graduate, had the lead role of Edvard Grieg in the New York City Opera's production of "The Song of Norway" last year. He also toured the country for the opera company's performances of "La Traviata."

Brandstetter will be accompanied on piano by Gary Magby. He will perform pieces by Handel, Strauss, Ravel, Bizet, Respighi and Ives. Brandstetter's 1982-83 season also includes the New York City Opera's performances of "Madame Butterfly" and "La Boheme" in New York City and Los Angeles, "The Barber of Seville" with Rochester Opera, "La Traviata" with the Opera Theater of St. Louis, "Faust" in Omaha, concerts with the Lincoln Symphony and Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic and recitals across America.

Quartet to perform at Sheldon concert
