evidenced among students and an attachment to passion in the stead of reason.

Mumgaard's comments would not be so troublesome (and would have been summarily dismissed) were it not for the fact that his "feelings," and actions based upon "feelings," pervade the "freeze" movement. There may be good reasons to oppose the Reagan administration's defense policies. However, the freeze movement has not been able to responsibly communicate good justifications for

a freeze due to the virtual flood of material written by individuals looking for a cause in which to believe; individuals then impassioned beyond the clear use of reason.

That Mumgaard may have good reasons to believe that he does support a freeze, and engage in a responsible dialogue may be true. That Mumgaard presented any good reasons in his column is not true. As it stands, Mumgaard simply engaged in irresponsible advocacy.

ECG (EKG) is an abbreviation for an electrocardiogram, which is a graphic record of the electric currents generated by the heart. By

reading the graph a doctor can determine several facts about the heart such as the heart rate, the heart's rhythm, whether the heart muscle is receiving enough blood, and whether there is an enlargement of any of the heart's four chambers.
