

# Vacation means top competition for tennis team

While most UNL students are relaxing over spring break, the UNL women's tennis team will be working out hard in New Mexico and Arizona.

Rising as early as 6:30 a.m. and playing until 6 p.m. some days, the team will face New Mexico, Idaho, New Mexico State, Denver, and Utah in Albuquerque, then travel to Arizona State and Mesa Jr. College.

Coach Kathy Hawkins said she thinks the spring road trip will definitely be

beneficial for the team.

"Last year we had minimal travel," she said, "So there wasn't as much good competition. Most of the teams we face on the spring trip are fairly equal to us.

"We'll be playing five outdoor matches in three days," she said, "We may drop one or two because of that."

The Huskers are now 4-2 on the season, after easily defeating the University of North Dakota 9-0 Monday. Both their losses were 5-4 matches and Hawkins said the team has learned from those.

"The team is playing more aggressive-

ly," she said, "On both the baseline and the net. They are also more aggressive in trying to get to the net."

She said the team is playing smarter, and more patiently, trying to pick out the opponents' weaknesses rather than just going out and playing their game.

Hawkins, a former tennis standout at UNL herself, said Cindi Reiman will continue at the number one singles spot.

Also, Jamie Piscarcik played well last week in the matches against Iowa, Minnesota and Wichita State.

Freshman Liz Mooney, playing at the

number four singles, is performing very well, Hawkins said. Mooney is 5-0 in singles play and also posts a 5-1 doubles performance.

But Hawkins said the most notable gain over last year's 14-11 club is the added depth of this year's squad.

That team, which finished fourth in the Big Eight, returned two seniors, two juniors, and three sophomores to this year's squad.

Hawkins said the team is shooting for a third place finish in the conference this spring.
