An executive of USA Today, the nation's only national newspaper, and several other distinguished journalists will visit the UNL School of Journalism during Journalism Week, Wednesday through Friday. Peter S. Prichard, deputy editorial director of USA Today, will speak about the national publication Wednesday at 8 p.m. in the Nebraska Union Centennial Room. Prichard is second in command of USA Today's opinion and inquiry pages. He also has been assistant to Allen Neuharth, chairman of the board and president of Gannett Co., Inc. The idea for J-Week came from the school's Student Advisory Council, Neale Copple, dean of the School of Journalism, said. "The students, headed by Carla Cover, and advised by Associate Dean Wilma Crumley, both planned the program and helped pick the speakers," Copple said.
