"I will not strike back, even if they kill us," Nehru says matter-of-factly.

"In this cause, I too am prepared to die," Gandhi says, encouraging his lifelong friend. "There is no cause for which I am prepared to kill. If they kill us, they shall have our bodies, but they shall never have our beach."

"Don't be such a Gloomy Gus," Deadhead chimes in. "Just think - 350 million people out on the beach enjoying themselves! If you want to throw this party, I'm with you all the way, Daddy-o. For my part, I'll sell milk shakes at cost and hire a band to play. Sure, I'm taking a loss, but anything for a free India and an open beach!"

You get the idea. The summer movie and grand statements about the human condition just don't go together. Education and self-improvement are important, lifelong goals, but certainly too much has been made of the business of education at the expense of good Old fashioned "R and R."
