KFAB submitted a sealed bid to the University (as did WOW, KLIN, KFOR and KLMS) for the rights. Their winning bid was about \$540,000 a year for five years. So, this fall, Don Gill and Joe Patrick will be on the sidelines, Tim Moreland will be doing Minnesota Viking games, and Ray Scott has moved on to UCLA. Like him or not - and there are plenty of the latter - KFAB's "Mr. Football" is your only choice.

Some poor souls don't especially care for Mr. Bremser's style of play-by-play. They say he's too old, too slow, and misses too many things. They add that he gets too excited, and really isn't unbiased. Well, I say that Lyell Bremser's broadcasts are good, exciting and most importantly, makes you feel like your in the stadium.
