## NUFoundation grants eight new fellowships

NU President Ronald Roskens has announced a new scholarship program for graduate students on all three campuses.

Eight fellowships totaling \$50,000 will be granted for the 1983-84 academic year: four at UNL, and two each at the NU Medical Center and UNO.

Roskens said campus committees will submit nominations to chancellors, who then will forward recommendations to him.

Qualifying students must demonstrate a high level of scholastic and personal accomplishment and must have advanced to the final stages of their degree programs, Roskens said.

The NU Foundation will fund the program. "We are indebted to friends of the university who generously support the foundation, and its enthusiasm to make possible this program," Roskens said.

He said he hoped the fellowship program will be "substantially increased" in the future.

## **Fund A fees** refunds ready By Peggy Polacek

UNL students can apply now for the \$5.16 Fund A refunds for the 1983-84 fall semester.

Refund applications became available Monday for students, and are available until Sept. 30. Money is refunded only for Fund A fees, which help finance student organizations. The Association of Students of the University of Nebraska, the Nebraska State Student Association, the Daily Nebraskan and the University Program Council comprise the Fund A organizations.

Free legal services will not be provided from ASUN if this fee is refunded. and students will not receive a discount on classified ads in the Daily Nebraskan. A refund for UPC fees prohibits students from attending free university classes, speakers, films, performing arts programs and coffeehouses. Student-priced tickets will not be available to those students for UPC films, concerts, dances, trips or tournaments. The refund process began on May 17, 1980, when the NU Board of Regents adopted the policy that all students must pay Fund A fees, but that they are eligible to receive a refund. Any student may re-quest a refund for all, or part of Fund A fees. Students enrolled for seven or more credit hours will pay \$88.20 per semes-ter for both Fund A and B fees. Fund A fees breakdown as follows: ASUN -\$1.34; NSSA — 50 cents; Daily Nebraskan — 90 cents; UPC — \$2.42. Doug Metzger, director of Student Activities and Financial Services, said 648 refunds were given for the 1982-83 school year. During the 1981-82 school year, 567 students received refunds. Metzger attributed the increase of 81 refunds between the two years to students becoming aware of the refund policy. He said it is too early to tell if the increase in refunds will continue this year. Students interested in Fund A refunds may pick up applications at the Stu-dent Activities Financial Services office, Nebraska Union 222; ASUN office, Nebraska Union 115; or East CAP office, East Union. Once the form is completed, it must be returned to the Financial Services office. A copy of the refund is given to the student and his ID card is punched to indicate he is not eligible for Fund A privileges. No ID cards will be replaced once punches are made. **Continued** to Page 12


